Showground Entry

Gate entry must be paid for all competitors & their family/friends/assistants. Everyone must wear their Dalgety Show wristband whilst in the showgrounds. Showground entry tickets can be purchased via Global Entries. To gain entry to the grounds, the Global Entries receipt **MUST** be presented to the Gate Attendants at GATE 2 ONLY, at which point, their name will be marked off and they will be issued with their Showground wristband/s.

Secretaries Office

The Office will be open at the Pavilion on Saturday 5-9pm and Sunday 6.30am-1.30pm. This is where tickets can be purchased, waivers can be handed in and prize money/ribbons collected.

- Ring 1 - 8.30am
- Ring 2 - 8.00am
- Ring 3 - 9.30am with Fancy dress, entry fee \$10.00 for the day
- Ring 4 - Sporting - 9.30am-12pm, entry fee \$10.00 for the day, prize money and ribbons can be collected from horse secretary tent 12.30pm-1.30pm.
- Ring 5 - Showjumping - 8.00am

Tickets, Wristbands, Waivers, Fees and Prize Money

- Pre-purchased tickets will be available for collection from the Horse Secretaries Office upon submission of the Global Entries receipt and a signed waiver. Competitors entering on the day will be required to submit a completed waiver along with the appropriate fee to the Horse Section office. Entries on the day will incur a \$1 late fee per class.

- Tickets are to be surrendered to Ring Stewards upon entry to the relevant ring. Wristbands must be worn when competing/assisting. Entry to warm up rings or arena will not be permitted without a wristband.
- Ring 5 Showjumping entries are pre-entry only. Competitors must present their waiver to the Office and receive a wristband in return. Riders will NOT be permitted into the warmup ring or arena without a Waiver wristband.
- Stockman's Challenge: Pre-entry only to miners@skymesh.com.au, no entries on the day
- Anyone leading horses for younger riders are required to submit a waiver.
- Riders and handlers for Ring 3 will be issued with a stamp indicating entry has been paid for all classes in Ring 3. Riders and handlers in Ring 3 are not eligible to enter Rings 1 or 2 (excludes adults accompanying younger children).
- Lost or misplaced entry tickets will not be refunded or re-produced.
- No refunds will be given for unused tickets or tickets purchased on the day. Refunds may be issued for pre-purchased tickets for all rings, prior to commencement of the show, upon providing a veterinary or medical certificate at the discretion of the Dalgety Show Society.
- All entry fees and prizes are specified on the schedule under their appropriate ring heading or class.
- Prize money can only be collected after 11am from the Horse Steward gazebo and must be collected on the day or it will be forfeited. Prize money for rings 1-3 will be presented at the same time as placings.
- Hack and Hunter classes will be in Ring 1
- Breeds, OTT and Fashions on the Field will be in Ring 2. Breed/OTT registration certificates will be required.

Rider Apparel

- Rings 1, 2 and 4 - No roper boots
- Showjumping – shirts of solid colour only, no jeans or roper boots

Parking

Parking within the showground is extremely limited. Parking is issued on a first in, first served basis with no bookings taken.

Vehicle Entry and Exits

Horse floats and trucks may enter the grounds through Gate 2 only until 7am on show day. After this time, Gate 2 will be closed to all traffic until 3pm as this is a frequent pedestrian passage. Any floats and trucks leaving prior to 3pm will be required to exit via Gate 3, which is a grass exit with a slight incline. This exit is unsuitable for large floats and trucks due to the tight corner involved. Any large trucks and floats wishing to camp on Saturday night yet wishing to leave the showground prior to 3pm will be required to remove their vehicle from the grounds via Gate 2 prior to 7am on show day. Must produce receipt of global entry fees paid or you will pay again.

Yards & Hot Tape

Dalgety Showground has 55 yards available for use. Showground yards must be pre-booked and attract a fee of \$5 per yard (valid for use on Saturday 2nd and Sunday 3rd March only). Yard positions will be assigned on a random basis unless a specific location has been requested. YARDS MUST NOT BE EXTENDED. Bookings for yards will only be

accepted through Global Entries Online. Select a Round per yard required. If maximum number of rounds is reached, select additional yards from separate yard 'class'.

Due to restricted space, portable yards are a max 3x3m per horse but can be combined into 1 larger yard to accommodate multiple horses (i.e. 1x 9x9 yard to house 3 horses together).

If a horse is in a yard assigned to someone else, the horse may be relocated to a safe area by Show Officials. This may also occur if there is a welfare concern for the horse. The horse will be placed in a safe area and the owner must present to the Horse Steward Gazebo. No compensation will be made if a class is missed due to their horse having been relocated.

Camping

Free-of-charge camping is available but is limited inside the grounds. Should power be required, competitors are advised to bring a long, tagged extension lead. Leads will be checked and if not Tested & Tagged, they may be removed. PLEASE NOTE: Due to the ongoing works at the Pavilion, there are NO SHOWERS at the Showground.

If anyone camping on site anticipates leaving the grounds prior to 3pm on show day, they are advised to remove their vehicle from the grounds prior to 7am on the same day (see above section on Vehicle Entry & Exits). It is highly recommended that large trucks, goosenecks etc planning on leaving prior to 3pm do move their vehicles due to the restricted access and tight corner involved in exiting the grounds via Gate 3.

Rules & Regulations

CRUELTY TO ANIMALS IN ANY FORM WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED

- This event is an EA affiliated event and as such Ring events are run in accordance with the Equestrian Australia National Show Horse Rules. Exceptions to EA attire are permitted for Ring 3 and 4, which are considered 'Fun & Sporting Classes'. All Show jumping classes are run in accordance with the Equestrian Australia National Jumping Rules. All results will be forwarded to both EA and ASC.
- All competition at this show is governed by these regulations and by the Agricultural Societies Council of NSW Rules for Discipline in Horse Sections at Shows, which can be viewed at www.agshowsnsw.org.au. Should it become necessary for the ASC Disciplinary Committee to open an inquiry into any aspect of competition in this Horse Section, this Society will support any penalty imposed by that Committee as a result of the inquiry and will support penalties resulting from enquiries arising from Horse Sections at other NSW shows.
- The Show Society will take all care in managing the Section, but competitors taking part in this Horse Section do so at their own risk. Each competitor/responsible guardian must, before competing, complete and sign a form indemnifying the Dalgety Show Society and waiving any claims against the Society for any injury sustained in competition or for loss or damage to the competitor's property or damage caused by the competitor or his/her animal(s) at the Show. On each Waiver, each horse with which the competitor is involved in competition at the Show must be listed together with the Property Identification Code (PIC) of the property from which the horse came to the Show.

- All riders must wear EA approved headwear, as listed below, at any time whilst on horseback, including walking jump courses, warming up and walking to or from rings.
 - Current Australian standard AS/NZS 3838 (2006 onwards) provided they are SAI Global marked.
 - New Australian standard ARB HS 2012 provided they are SAI Global marked.
 - Current American standard ASTM F1163 (2004a or 04a onwards) provided they are SEI marked.
 - Current American standard SNELL E2001.
 - Current British standard PAS 015 (1998 or 2011) provided they are BSI Kitemarked.
 - Interim European Standard VG1 (01.040: 2014-12) with or without BSI Kitemark.
- The Show Committee reserves the right to change the program at any time.
- Show Committee reserves the right to refuse entry to classes at any time. This will be done if there are concerns for the welfare of the horse or safety of the rider, other competitors, officials or spectators.
- Competitors must choose between Hack and Hunter and may not compete in both.
- Rings will not be delayed or held up for competitors. Competitors may be required to choose between classes in the event they clash.
- No person is permitted to enter the ring or approach the judge unless announced by the steward to enter for a class. No competitor will present for judging before a judge with whom he/she has a family relationship, has or has recently had a personal relationship or has had horse related business dealings during the past twelve months.
- All protests must be submitted in writing with a \$50.00 fee within 30 minutes of completion of the class to the Horse Steward Gazebo.
- Dalgety Show does not have an official measuring stand and all decisions will be made at the discretion of the Ring Judge.
- Stallions:
 - may not compete in open classes hack or hunter (exc ANSA).
 - must be controlled with a bit at all times
 - may compete in show jumping events.
 - must be controlled by a person 17 years or older except ASH, which is 18 years.
- The judge may use his/her discretion to determine if a suitable number of entrants are present for each class. If there are an unsuitable number of entrants, the judge may choose to abandon the class or combine the class with a similar class and judge to a suitable mediation.
- Any person detected coaching a competitor while that competitor is being judged may be removed from the Showground.
- Any exhibitor or associate who behaves offensively on the Showground will be expelled from the ground, may be banned from the show in future and may be banned by other Societies.
- The age of all horses is calculated as from 1st August. Every horse foaled before 1st August in year shall be deemed to be 1 year old on that date
- Novice – not placed first in an individual class hack, hunter or riding class at any equivalent show.

- Drug testing may be carried out at this show.
- Dogs must not be taken into the vicinity of the warm up area, jumping or show rings and must be restrained at all times when in camping/parking areas.
- All horses in Breed Classes must be registered in the relevant Association/Society and must have papers present at the show. These papers must be presented upon request of the stewards.
- Competitors affected by alcohol or illicit drugs will be immediately removed from competition without refund of entry fees.
- All power/electrical leads being used MUST be Tested & Tagged.



NSW/ACT OTT Series Regulations

1. The event is open to all Thoroughbreds who are registered with a recognised Studbook:
Eg: Aust. Studbook/NZ Studbook/Irish Studbook. A life number!!
All Thoroughbreds are required to be 3 yrs and over and over 14.2hh.
*Registrations will be checked.
2. Racing name to be used, if unraced they are to use unraced with breeding.
3. Qualifying Shows must be affiliated with Agricultural Societies Council of NSW Ltd, Show Horse Council of Australasia Inc, Equestrian Australia.
4. OTT Qualifying classes will be judged as a 'Ridden' class.
5. Once a qualifier has been won, the horse cannot compete in other qualifiers within the season. Horses that have achieved Runner Up are able to continue in the competition unless they win an OTT Qualifier class.
The winner and runner up of each qualifying class will be eligible to compete in the State Final
6. Horses will be judged as a good example of a Thoroughbred rather than riding horse/hunter types with the following being taken into consideration.
 - Thoroughbred qualities
 - Conformation
 - Manners, paces and performance
 - Injuries caused through racing such as blemishes are allowed
7. Judges decision is final in qualifiers and final.
8. Horse and Owner MUST reside in NSW/ACT to compete in the Off the Track NSW/ACT Series.
9. The state final will be held at the 'Thoroughbred Spring Fair'.

The “Nimmity Bell” show jumping pointscore is a competition run over 4 shows – Nimmitabel, Delegate, Dalgety and Bombala. The “Nimmity Bell” trophy is to be awarded to the horse & rider combination with the highest pointscore in open competition over 4 shows. This will be awarded at the completion of EA events at the Bombala Show.

1. Only horses registered with the EA of NSW are eligible for the pointscore. Horses can only score in EA events in classes 1.10m or higher, the event has a total prize pool worth \$100 or more, the event is officiated by an EA accredited Judge and Course Designer. All entrants in these events will be eligible for the “Nimmity Bell Pointscore” regardless of the total amount of entries in one class.
2. A horse & rider combination can only score once at each show. This score will be their best placing from that show. If a horse fails to place in an event, it will score zero for that show. The points will be awarded as follows: 1st = 5 points, 2nd = 4 points, 3rd = 3 points, 4th = 2 points, 5th = 1 point, no placing yet eligible = 0 points. In the case of “tied” placings the points will be split, the same way as prizemoney.
3. Horses must compete at all 4 shows to be eligible for the “Nimmity Bell Pointscore”. The only exception will be if an official vet / doctor’s certificate is presented to the official scorer indicating the horse/ rider’s inability to compete at one of the 4 shows. The official point scorer for 2019 is Sam Platts, (0409032019).
4. Results will be forwarded to Michael for recording from the official Judge/show committee of each show and then allocated points according to the rules above. Any disputes regarding the “Nimmity Bell Pointscore” must be directed to the official point scorer to be dealt with. Official protest/s must be made in writing within 1 hour of the class being completed and must be accompanied by \$50.00 and presented to the Official Point scorer. All events are EA events and will be run in accordance to EA rules.
5. Please note: It is requested that EA summer dress standards apply for competitors at all four shows (no polo shirts – shirt with tie or stock to be worn). 6. Overall prize money will be awarded to the top 5 place getters at the completion of EA events at Bombala Show.
